ABOUT

The United States Agency for International Development (USAID)-funded Health Workforce Management (HWM) Activity is a five-year project (2020 – 2025) supporting the establishment of a cost-effective, well-trained, and motivated primary health workforce, particularly in targeted rural and remote areas of Bauchi, Ebonyi, Federal Capital Territory (FCT), Kebbi and Sokoto States. Banyan Global implements the HWM Activity in collaboration with Abt Associates, the Institute for health care Improvement (IHI), and Solina Health. HWM also collaborates with the Federal and State governments, local experts, training institutions, and the private sector.


Over the past three years, the HWM Activity has supported institutions in its focus States that train frontline primary health care (PHC) workers to improve the quality of health worker training. One of HWM's initiatives was the award of tuition scholarships to disadvantaged girls to help improve the graduation rate and contribute to increasing the female health workforce in rural PHC facilities in the HWM focus States.
